When using the Teflon polish on your hull be sure to use it on the blades. Both rudder and centerboard will stay clean and fast plus the centerboard will be easier to move up and down due to reduced friction.

OPTISAILORS HULL CHANGES 2007

The following 3 items and others are under consideration for changes to the Optisailors hull for 2007. Look for our displays at upcoming regattas.

1. Closing the centerboard slot

Rule 3.2.6.1 (i) states that "Non metallic material may be placed within 30 mm of each end of the top and bottom of the slot to act as positioning and protection of the Daggerboard." Most builders have been placing 10 mm rubber inserts at the corners to protect the boat and the boards from each other. We have been experimenting with a molded insert that takes advantage of the full 30 mm at both ends effectively reducing the length of the slot by 2 3/8 inches. The inserts are shaped to the fore and aft edges of the Daggerboard. The rule also requires that the inserts be removable for measurement.

The overall effect is to:

- A. Protect the boat from the New Rule epoxy foils, which can cut into the boat very quickly.
- B. Reduce turbulence by not allowing water into the slot at the fore and aft ends.

C. Position the centerboard consistently in the slot for more uniform performance. Initially this option will only be available on the Optisailors hulls. Several will be on display and in use at the Midwinters.

ON THE STARTING LINE – A paid testimonial

Recently I sailed in 2 major MC Scow Regattas. My starts in 11 races against 88 other MC's were good enough to get me to the first mark in the top 5. Having been racing sailboats for 49 years I asked, "What made the difference?" Previously I had always used

a wrist starting watch on my right (Starboard) arm. Some where between 10 and 20 seconds to go I always stopped looking at the watch and became more concerned with the

boats below and above me. At this regatta, I used one of the new Optiparts timers with 1 ¼ inch numbers mounted in front of me where it was in continuous view. This made all the difference. With the wristwatch I was never able to precisely know the time and keep an eye on the fleet. With the timer, I could easily check the time without ignoring the fleet. You can either watch the boats around you or the clock, you cannot do both. With the large number timer I would set up about 2 boat lengths below the line or parallel to the boats around me. At about 12 seconds to go I proceeded to bring the boat to full speed (Hopefully with a hole above and below me). At 4 seconds I was pointing as high as I could. After about 20 seconds I would look down the line and find myself 3 to 4 boat lengths out above the fleet going full speed with the balance of the fleet still getting up to speed.
